From the Principal . . .

Parents and students – prior to our Spring Break, I announced to our faculty my plan to retire from the Baltimore County Public Schools effective June 30, 2015. It is with mixed emotions that I take this step, as being principal of Eastern Tech has been the most rewarding and truly wonderful assignment I've ever experienced.

2015 marks my 46<sup>th</sup> year of service to the students, teachers, and parents of public schools in Maryland and Missouri. I'm proud of a career that has crossed six decades and provided me with an opportunity to work in three major school systems. I began teaching mathematics in the Anne Arundel County Public Schools back in 1969. I remained in Anne Arundel for 22 years as a teacher, an assistant principal, a principal, and as Director of the AACPS Administrative Assessment Center. I left Anne Arundel in 1990 to become the Director of Middle Schools in the Kansas City Missouri School District. I was recruited by Dr. Walter Marks, Superintendent of the KCMSD, to work in the "largest court-ordered desegregation project in U.S. history" that was occurring there at that time. Many of us were brought to Kansas City from positions around the country to help with that effort.

I returned to MD in the mid-90's to become principal of Perry Hall Middle School, followed by a short stint as the Coordinator of Mathematics for the BCPS, and an appointment as principal of Catonsville Middle School. In 2004, Dr. Joe A. Hairston, Superintendent, asked me to become the principal of Randallstown High School. After four years at RHS, he assigned me to move to Eastern Technical High School. Little did I know, at that time, how remarkable an assignment this would be.

I arrived at Eastern Tech on July 1, 2007. I knew of ET's positive reputation from working in the county, but wasn't fully prepared for how remarkable and focused the students are, how supportive the community is of our school, and how strong and caring the teaching staff is. It is this combination of strengths that has enabled ET to be named a MD Blue Ribbon School of Excellence and a National Blue Ribbon School during my years here. I also credit our students, teachers, and community support for our consistent recognition by *The Washington Post*, *Newsweek Magazine* and *U. S. News & World Report* as "one of American's best high schools" for the past eight years. I appreciate the positive attention given to my leadership during these past eight years, but I give more credit to the students, teachers, and parents for our positive results.

My future is still in the planning stage. I am very thankful for my good health, energy, and the support of my wife, children and grand-children to continue doing some productive work in the field of education while enjoying the opportunity to spend more time with each of them. Eastern Tech will continue to thrive.

I cannot thank you enough for your friendship and support and wish you only the best as you continue on the amazing journey upon which we have embarked. My life has been enriched by the opportunity to work with you, your children, this school and community.

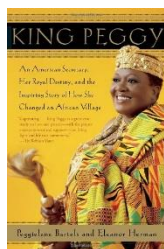
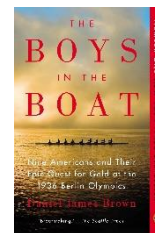
Students in Grade 9 are expected to read the following selection:



*Outcasts United* by Warren St. John. Set against the backdrop of a fading American town struggling to accommodate its new arrivals, *Outcasts United* is the stunning real-life story of an inspiring group of refugees and a woman who, with tough love and fiery determination, changes an entire community for the better. Highly successful in a previous school activity, this work has been pre-selected for 9<sup>th</sup> graders for their first year in the ET academic community.

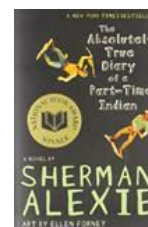
Students in grades 10, 11, & 12 may select one title from the list below. Students are strongly encouraged to read more than one selection.

*The Boys in the Boat: Nine Americans and Their Epic Quest for Gold at the 1936 Berlin Olympics* by Daniel James Brown. *The Boys in the Boat* is the dramatic story of the American rowing team that stunned the world at Hitler's 1936 Berlin Olympics. Daniel James Brown shares the improbable, intimate story of nine working-class American boys who embodied determination and optimism. The team's friendship, shared adversity, and trust in each other helped them become the legendary team that defeated the most elite rivals, including the German crew rowing for Adolf Hitler.



*King Peggy: An American Secretary, Her Royal Destiny, and the Inspiring Story of How She Changed an African Village* by Peggilene Bartels and Eleanor Herman. King Peggy chronicles the journey of an American secretary, Peggilene Bartels, who suddenly finds herself king to a town of 7,000 people on Ghana's central coast, half a world away. Peggy's first two years as king of Otum unfold in a way that is stranger than fiction. In the end, a deeply traditional African town is uplifted by the ambitions of its decidedly modern female king, and Peggy is herself transformed, from an ordinary secretary to the heart and hope of her community.

*The Absolutely True Diary of a Part-time Indian* by Sherman Alexie. *True Diary* is a semi-autobiographical work of fiction that details the life of Arnold Spirit (a.k.a. Junior), a 14-year-old budding cartoonist living on the Spokane Indian Reservation in Washington State. With humor and grace, Alexie's book—a 2007 National Book Award winner—tackles poverty, bullying, and family struggle. **Please note:** This selection may contain some potentially objectionable language and mention of (but no description of) teen self-discovery, which may be inappropriate for younger, immature readers.



**Note to Parents:** All selections have earned positive reviews and awards and are recognized as books suitable for young adults; nevertheless, some selections may contain content, situations, and/or language that various parents may find objectionable. ET advises parents to guide your children toward selecting the most appropriate book for your family.

**Expectations for Eastern Tech Students:** A major grades in the subject of English will be to complete this independent reading project. This activity is scheduled to take place after September 30, 2015; however, students may be asked to complete initial activities during the first weeks of school. Stop by the library or ask your English teacher for details. Students in grades 10, 11, and 12 should read at least one selection from the above list and be prepared to complete a related reading activity. Focus your reading on the following elements: character development, language, theme, conflict, setting, cultural issues, and plot. Also, familiarize yourself with the meaning(s) of new vocabulary words from the reading.

Eastern Tech seeks to encourage a community of readers. The titles above have been selected because they fit a broad range of reading abilities and interests, are relevant to young adult experience, attempt to stretch students intellectually, and because they expose students to a variety of ideas and/or cultures. All selections have earned positive reviews and awards for their literary value and are recognized as suitable for high school readers; nevertheless, some selections may contain content, situations, and/or language that various parents may find objectionable. We recommend that as parents you guide your children in selecting the most appropriate book for your family. Have a safe and enjoyable summer.

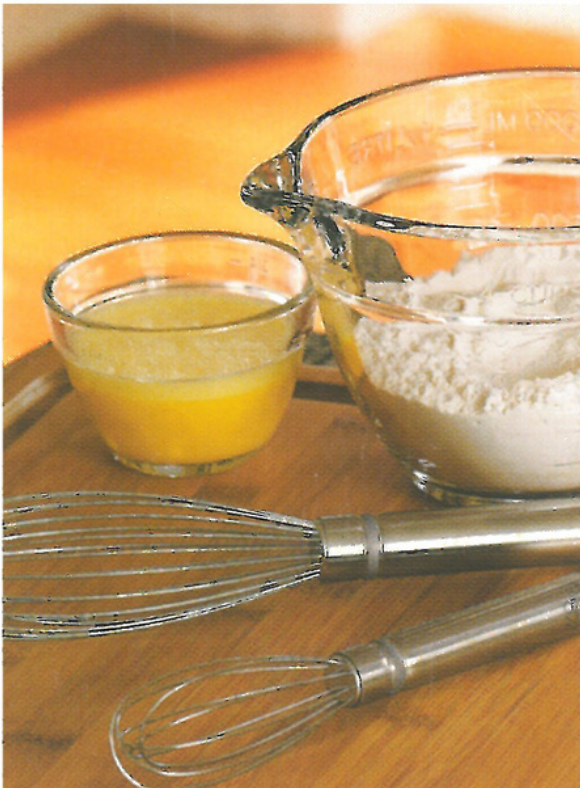
