

## School Counseling Corner,

The School Counselors at ET; Ms. Donna Murphy, Ms. Debra James and Ms. Kathy Lavery welcome you to the 2015-16 school year. Counselors are already in classrooms presenting information about college admissions and teaching Foundation of Technology. In a week or two counselors will conduct classroom lessons on PSAT preparation for all 9<sup>th</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup> and 11 graders. The PSAT will be administered at ET on October 14, 2015. The counseling office is excited to host several informational events: the first event being Senior College Night at Eastern Tech on Wednesday September 16. This event provides parents of seniors the opportunity to hear from the school counselors regarding the college admissions and application process. Parents will also have the opportunity to learn more about *Naviance*, a platform to assist students and families in the college and career process. Counselors are planning an event for 9<sup>th</sup> grade parents in early November where Parents can learn about the high school transcript, the importance of extracurricular activities, the impact that social media can and does have on students, and navigating the college process (yes, it begins in 9<sup>th</sup> grade).

There are some wonderful activities being run by school counselors this year. Ms. James hosts the Diversity Club. Students and counselors work tirelessly to promote anti-bullying, discuss coping strategies and stress management, and encourage every student to “be themselves”. Ms. Murphy is the sponsor for the National Honor Society. Each of the 135 members of the NHS is mentoring at least one member of the class of 2019. If you stop by school you may see a sea of Orange t-shirts with Mentor 2015. These orange clad NHS members are assisting 9<sup>th</sup> graders with adjusting to high school and time management.

Attached you will find a wonderful resource that the counselors use with students throughout the school year, especially used at course registration/planning time. The 4-year plan is a way for students to map their courses so they can ensure that they have every possible Senior Option like a full schedule with AP courses, *Parallel Enrollment/College for Free* and Internships. Additionally, you are encouraged to visit the School Counseling page on the School Site to access documents like the *Jump Start* and *College Planning Guide*.




Students in Grade 9 are expected to read the following selection:


Students in grades 10, 11, & 12 may select one title from the list below. Students are strongly encouraged to read more than one selection.

*The Boys in the Boat: Nine Americans and Their Epic Quest for Gold at the 1936 Berlin Olympics* by Daniel James Brown. *The Boys in the Boat* is the dramatic story of the American rowing team that stunned the world at Hitler's 1936 Berlin Olympics. Daniel James Brown shares the improbable, intimate story of nine working-class American boys who embodied determination and optimism. The team's friendship, shared adversity, and trust in each other helped them become the legendary team that defeated the most elite rivals, including the German crew rowing for Adolf Hitler.



*King Peggy: An American Secretary, Her Royal Destiny, and the Inspiring Story of How She Changed an African Village* by Peggilene Bartels and Eleanor Herman. *King Peggy* chronicles the journey of an American secretary, Peggilene Bartels, who suddenly finds herself king to a town of 7,000 people on Ghana's central coast, half a world away. Peggy's first two years as king of Otum unfold in a way that is stranger than fiction. In the end, a deeply traditional African town is uplifted by the ambitions of its decidedly modern female king, and Peggy is herself transformed, from an ordinary secretary to the heart and hope of her community.

*The Absolutely True Diary of a Part-time Indian* by Sherman Alexie. *True Diary* is a semi-autobiographical work of fiction that details the life of Arnold Spirit (a.k.a. Junior), a 14-year-old budding cartoonist living on the Spokane Indian Reservation in Washington State. 


